

INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICE

Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) requires that residents and businesses divert organic material away from the landfill. Organic byproducts like food scraps, food soiled paper products, compostable paper, and yard trimmings make up a large portion of the waste that is dumped in the landfills each year.

Organics left to decompose in landfills release a greenhouse gas called methane. Methane traps the sun's heat and warms the atmosphere, contributing to climate change. Reducing organics in our garbage will help the climate crisis and extend the life of the Fink Road landfill. The County garbage collection service recycles the organics in the green cart and converts them for beneficial reuse. Non-organic recyclable materials in the blue cart are also recycled. We all need to do our part to save the environment and combat climate change.

Garbage Collection Service







- 1 Black Solid Waste (Landfill) cart
- 1 Blue Non-Organics (Recycle) cart *
- 1 Green Organic Waste (Compost) cart

*Note: The blue recycling cart will be picked up every other week.

Prevent Cart Contamination

- Avoid placing plastic bagged items inside the compost cart. Place your compostable materials inside a paper bag or directly into the cart.
- Avoid cart contamination by placing each acceptable item in their respective cart.
- Non-acceptable items in a cart can ruin an entire load of compost or recyclables and will have to go to the landfill for disposal.

Cart Contamination Monitoring

- SB 1383 requires the County to monitor carts and issue notice of violations for contamination.
- You may receive a notice if contamination is identified in your carts.
- Administrative citations may be issued if your carts are repeatedly contaminated.

Plastic bags, film and wrap



Newspaper, junk mail, office paper and magazines



Fruit and vegetable scraps





Metal cans and aluminum foil



Spoiled food, dairy products, egg shells and meat scraps





Pet waste, diapers and feminine products



Paper boxes, egg cartons and paper tubes



Soiled paper cups, paper plates, tissues and napkins





Glass food and beverage containers



Paper take-out containers and other food-soiled paper





Shelf-stable cartons



Plastic containers and other rigid plastic items



Yard Waste
